

UPDATE FROM THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR OF ALBERTA SEPTEMBER 2022 TO FEBRUARY 2023

MARKING A WATERSHED MOMENT IN CANADIAN HISTORY

September 8, 2022 was a watershed moment in our history, as Canadians joined with people around the world in marking the death of Queen Elizabeth II. Queen Elizabeth lived a life of selfless service, standing as a model of strength and stability, and navigating decades of challenge and change with compassion, grace and dignity. Although our world transformed in countless ways over the course of her reign, she never lost sight of her duties or her principles. We also know that she had a fondness for our province and country, and that special connection was reflected in the outpouring of memories, tributes and expressions of gratitude that we offered following her death.

Remembrance in Alberta took many forms. Countless people signed books of condolence in person and online, touching memorial ceremonies took place on the steps of the Legislature and at Anglican churches in Edmonton and Calgary, and the Edmonton Federal Building on the Legislature grounds was renamed the Queen Elizabeth II Building in her honour. Platinum Jubilee Medal ceremonies also continued across Alberta in tribute to her extraordinary legacy.

As part of her 2005 address to the Legislature during the Royal Tour to mark Alberta's Centennial, Queen Elizabeth said, "I want the Crown in Canada to represent everything that is best and most admired in the Canadian ideal. I will continue to do my best to make it so during my lifetime, and I hope you will all continue to give me your help in this task...as together we continue to build a country that remains the envy of the world." Albertans from every corner of the province, and from all walks of life, helped to make this ideal a reality through the decades, and we can all take comfort in knowing that the journey continues with His Majesty King Charles III.

I am deeply honoured to serve as His Majesty's representative in Alberta, and to be a part of the essential, ongoing role that the Crown plays in our system of government and our country as a whole. While His Majesty became Monarch immediately upon the death of Queen Elizabeth, the official Coronation ceremony and related festivities will take place in early May. I know that Albertans will embrace this opportunity to celebrate the King and the continuity of a tradition that sits at the heart of who we are as Canadians.

Platinum Jubilee Medals and Community Events

The Queen Elizabeth II's Platinum Jubilee Medal was presented to 7000 Albertans over the course of the program, in recognition of exemplary citizenship and dedicated service in a wide range of fields of endeavour.

Lieutenant Governor Lakhani hosted numerous medal presentation ceremonies in Edmonton and Calgary and had the pleasure of taking part in ceremonies hosted by: YW Calgary, the Indian Society of Calgary, Treaty 6 Chiefs, the Order of St. John, the Edmonton Centre for Newcomers, the Alberta Recreation and Parks Association, the Canada West Foundation, the Alberta Order of Excellence members, RCMP K Division, Calgary Police Service, and numerous members of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta.

Her Honour also took part in Platinum Jubilee tree planting events with Royal Canadian Air Cadets at Carewest Colonel Belcher in Calgary and students from Glenora School in Edmonton; celebrated Queen Elizabeth's legacy with Cadets from across Alberta at a Tri Service Cadet Platinum Jubilee Ball in Calgary; and learned from young Canadians at Queen Elizabeth Scholars Symposium in Edmonton hosted by the Right Honourable David Johnston and the Rideau Hall Foundation.

Her Honour participates in the School at the Legislature program, meeting with Grade 6 classes as part of their studies on the Canadian system of government. Recent visits included: École Frère Antoine, Anne Fitzgerald, St. Kateri, St. John Bosco, and Tipaskan Schools from Edmonton; Eleanor Hall School from Clyde; École des Quatre-Vents from Peace River; and Richard S. Fowler Junior High from St. Albert. Her Honour also enjoyed virtual visits with classes from Davidson Creek Elementary in Sherwood Park and Prince of Wales School in Calgary, and stopped by in person to learn from students at Youngstown School in Edmonton. She visited Steinhauer and St. Mark's Schools for Read-In Week.

Remembrance week events included receiving the first poppy from the AB NWT Legion Command on October 27 to officially kick-off Alberta activities. Her Honour also attended the annual No Stone Left Alone ceremony at Beechmount Cemetery in Edmonton, the Aboriginal Veterans Remembrance Ceremony at the Legislature, the Field of Crosses Night of Lights in Calgary, and a Remembrance Day ceremony held at the Southern Alberta Jubilee Auditorium.

As part of her ongoing constitutional duties, Her Honour swore-in Danielle Smith as the 19th Premier of Alberta on October 11 and swore-in the new members of Cabinet on October 24. She also read the Speech from the Throne to open the Legislature Session, granted Royal Assent to bills brought forward by the Assembly, signed Orders in Council, and took part in the unveiling of the Legislature portrait of former Premier Rachel Notley on December 8.
